

# **MUSIC NOTES**



Joachim Neander, born in 1650, came from a family of four generations of preachers. Joachim became a Calvinist pastor in his twenties and wrote nearly sixty hymns including those we still sing today. Five of his hymns are in our current hymnal. "Praise Ye the Lord, the Almighty", was written when he was only age thirty and ill. Joachim Neander passed away of tuberculosis later that same year.

Two hundred years later, Neanderthal fossils were discovered in the valley caves where Joachim Neander had loved to hike and roam near Dusseldorf, Germany. "Thal" means valley in Old German, and the valley was named by the local people "Neanderthal." The valley had been named for Joachim Neander by the people who knew his love of the area where he would a so preach sermons to the local villagers. The Neanderthal discoveries were found to be remains of very early people of strength. Joachim Neander's family name is now known the world over after such dedication to their preaching of the Gospel for generations!


Dear Church Members,


