# Why are We Having A Church Conference

#### What has led the Church Leadership to Consider a New Leadership Structure?

At Inman UMC, we are blessed with people who love their church and are willing to step up wherever there is a need. However, that same commitment—while admirable—has, over time, become a heavy burden. As our membership has declined and our pool of active volunteers has grown smaller, many of our leaders are now serving in multiple roles for many years, attending frequent meetings, and carrying more responsibility than is sustainable. Simply put: we are burning out the very people we depend on the most.

This reality has become increasingly clear over the last couple of years. In response, the Administrative Board has worked diligently to explore meaningful solutions. Over the past several months, through prayer, study, and intentional listening, we have considered whether a new model of church governance could better support both the life and mission of our congregation.

#### What We Discovered

Through our discernment season of reading *Mission Possible: A Simplified Structure for Missional Effectiveness*, working with the Conference coach, gathering church participation statistics, and holding listening sessions with groups in the church, what we have learned was both sobering and clarifying:

- Inman UMC currently has 90 committee positions, but only 52 active participants in the life of the church—many of whom are limited in how they can serve due to health, family, or other personal circumstances.
- Of the 56 positions on our four governing committees (Trustees, Finance, Staff-Parish Relations, and Administrative Board), only 28 individuals are currently serving—21 of whom are carrying multiple roles. Only 10 people are serving on a committee that are not also serving on the 4 governing committees.
- Each year, the Nominations Committee struggles more and more to fill all the necessary leadership positions. Many of our most dedicated leaders have expressed exhaustion and a growing sense of burnout and are not able to rotate off after their time is up.
- As a result, people are often serving not where they are most gifted or passionate, but rather out of a sense of obligation—simply to help keep our church afloat.

This structure is not only unsustainable—it's also misaligned with our mission. While our committees work faithfully, the current model tends to prioritize maintaining the status quo rather than advancing our mission.

Meanwhile, we are facing the broader challenge of church decline. Active participation has been decreasing for several years, with the number of deaths now outpacing new memberships. Since 2014, we have gone from an average in-person attendance in worship of 120 to 44 today.

#### **Finding a Way Forward**

In light of these challenges, the Administrative Board–accepting the recommendation of the SAS Discernment Team–believes the **Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS)** presents a hopeful and viable way forward. This model would consolidate our four main governing committees into a single Leadership Board made up of nine individuals, tasked with overseeing the strategic and missional direction of our church.

This structure would increase efficiency by reducing administrative demands and free up people to do the work of ministry. Instead of focusing on internal administration, more people would be able to focus on our mission: "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World."

This is not a decision we take lightly. But through prayerful conversation, our church leadership has come to believe that without a significant change to how we operate, our future as a congregation is at risk. For us to thrive and remain on mission, whether through the SAS model or another streamlined approach, we must consolidate committees, refocus on engaging our community, and adopt a culture of accountable, mission-focused leadership.

#### What's Next?

With the recommendation of the Administrative Board, the next step will be an in-person Church Conference vote on **Sunday, June 22 at 5:00 p.m. in the sanctuary.** All professing members will be eligible to vote.

In preparation, we will be hosting Town Hall Meetings where you'll have the opportunity to learn more about the SAS model, ask questions, and pray with one another as we seek God's direction. Town Halls will be held on **Wednesday, May 7 at 6:30 pm** and **Sunday, June 1 at 12:00pm**. We are encouraging all members to attend a Town Hall session, as together, we continue to discern God's will for our church. If you have any questions, you are encouraged to talk with one of the discernment team members, Lay Leaders, or the Pastor.

Our Vision: We envision a world in which older adults are celebrated for the lives they have lived, the wisdom they share and everything they have yet to teach us.


The Wesley Woods Mother's Day offering will help in the financial assistance for meals, housing, wellness programs and Pastoral care for the 1800 older residents each year.
